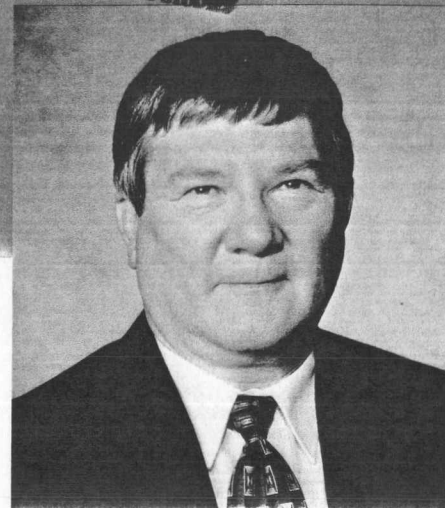

Bill served as District Superintendent of the Conception Bay South Integrated School Board from 1978 to 1989. In 1989, he was appointed Superintendent of the Avalon Consolidated School Board, a position he held until 1996. Since that time, he has worked as Assistant Director of Labour Relations for the Newfoundland and Labrador School Board's Association.

As District Superintendent, Bill provided leadership and initiative in the renovation, expansion, and building of new school facilities. Under his direction, new schools were built in Paradise, Foxtrap, and St. Phillips/Portugal Cove. Furthermore, his teamwork approach to leadership led to improved policies on student evaluation, teacher evaluation, and general administration.

Bill has been actively involved in the community of Conception Bay South. During his 20 years as a resident, he has worked with the local minor hockey association as well as Chairman of the C.B.S. stadium commission. He is also a member of various local church communities.

Bill is committed to working on behalf of the citizens of Conception Bay South to bring about improvements in water and sewer services, better recreation facilities, and enhanced educational facilities.

Over the past decade we have had to make some tough decisions. But they were decisions necessary for change. Through it all we've never lost sight of how important health care and education are to the quality of life of Newfoundlanders and Labradorians.

Health Care

- Commitment to health care will total \$250 million, including 11 new facilities across the province.
- Increase funding for hospitals in 1999-2000 by \$45 million.
- Provide special funding of \$5 million for hospital equipment.
- Sue cigarette manufacturers for compensation for deaths and diseases caused by tobacco use.

Education

- Invest more than \$125 million in new and refurbished school facilities.
- Provide \$10 million for clean air and other school repairs.
- Freeze tuition at Memorial University and the College of the North Atlantic for at least two years.

Our Future.

While making the difficult, but necessary choices, we've eliminated a \$230 million deficit. We now have a budget surplus and are poised to make new fiscal choices for the future.

Fiscal

- Introduce a Seniors Tax Credit for low income seniors in the next budget.
- No tax increases in the budget and continue to take steps to reduce the payroll tax and begin to reduce personal income tax rates when it is fiscally prudent to do so.
- As recently as January 19, TD Bank reported that Newfoundland and Labrador will lead the country in economic growth this year with a 3.5% increase.

Tourism

- Increase investment in our tourism industry which supports 2,400 businesses and has a value of over \$500 million annually.
- Attract visitors by capitalizing on the significance of our 50th anniversary of joining Confederation through Soiree '99 and with the Viking Celebrations in 2000.

Information Technology

- Continue to develop this rapidly-growing sector of the new economy.
- Over 200 IT firms currently employ 6,000 people in the province and this sector continues to grow. It is responsible for revenues of \$500 million annually.

Our Time.

This is truly our time. We have a strong voice that we will use to drown out the give-aways of the past. And while we must never be afraid to say no when we are being denied a fair return on our resources, we must equally not be afraid to say yes when the deal is right.

- There will be no mine at Voisey's Bay unless a smelter and refinery are built in our province.
- Press ahead with the \$12 billion Labrador Hydro Project, including \$5.2 billion in new royalties and 13,200 direct jobs for Labradorians and Newfoundlanders.
- Encourage exploration for new mineral resources through a mineral prospecting initiative.
- Continue to diversify and grow our fishery which had one of its best years ever in 1997 generating \$575 million, up \$33 million over 1996.
