served as an executive member in that organization.


Floyd is no stranger in this constituency. He is aware

C.C.F. NOW

The C.C.F. Program is based on these fundamental principles:

- (a) What we desire for ourselves, we wish for all.
- (b) The full participation by the people in making their own policies, choosing their own representatives and democratically financing their own party, so that it shall be their own servant in Parliament.
- (c) The C.C.F. insists that Alberta needs a Hansard—a verbatim report of what is said and done in the legislature, so that the people may be informed.

For years the C.C.F. has urged the Social Credit government to adopt the basic principle of social planning. At last they have made a start with the five year plan. The C.C.F. agrees in principle with this plan but much must be added if it is to achieve worthwhile gains for all people.

1. OUR RESOURCES: Public Heritage instead of Private Monopoly

The C.C.F. proposes to attain a larger share of the natural resources for the people by:

- (a) Increase on oil royalties.
- (b) Development of government-held oil sections on checkerboard pattern by leasing to co-operatives or companies on highest royalty bid basis.
- (c) Public ownership and distribution of natural gas to assure that the needs for industrial development and employment opportunity are fully met.
- (d) Public ownership of electric power (now also F.U.A. policy), with compensation over a period of years to farmers who have paid for their lines.
- (e) Development of tar sands as a provincial project by the government.

3. Freedom from Unfair Taxation

- (a) A C.C.F. provincial government would accept a larger share of the responsibility now being borne in the form of debt by the municipalities.
- (b) The C.C.F. would urge that the Federal government amend the Bank Act to provide that assets of a province (including municipal assets) be discounted in a manner similar to the discounting of bankers securities now in practice. This would mean great savings in interest charges and provide adequately for financing of desirable public undertakings.

SOCIAL JUSTICE means simply that society provides for a fair and just relationship between all people.

2. No Private Profit in Health, Education or Public Safety

- (a) Progressive institution of complete health services, including hospital, medical, and dental service without charge to the individual.
- Interim steps toward this goal would consist of:
1. A non-profit, all-inclusive government health insurance plan.
 2. Immediate legislation to provide all old-age and disabled pensioners the same health services as are now provided only to pensioners receiving supplementary pension.

- (b) Education from public schools through university, trade, or technical schools without tuition costs to the student. Bursaries based on need. Free text books in all educational institutions.
- (c) Government automobile insurance at cost, and cost-basis compulsory insurance to cover public liability.

People on farms, in factories, forests, schools, hospitals, laboratories, etc., produce and distribute all the goods and services of the nation. All these workers are exploited by the same small privileged groups who own the nation's wealth. The C.C.F. believes our country's wealth should be shared to a larger extent by the people who produce it. Therefore:

- (a) THE C.C.F. SUPPORTS THE LEGISLATIVE PROGRAMS OF FARMERS AND TRADE UNIONS AND OTHER WORKERS.
- (b) A C.C.F. government would set up a Department of Co-operatives to assist producers and consumers in the development and expansion of co-operative enterprises of all kinds.

4. One for All and All for Each

The Social Credit government is centralizing more and more power in its own hands, particularly in educational and municipal matters. This is a threat to democracy. Part of this evil arises from lack of municipal financial assets. The provincial government has, in fact, moved its provincial debt onto the municipalities.
