



Iraq's relief needs under review by UN

BAGHDAD (Reuter) — A United Nations team is in Iraq assessing the country's aid needs as part of efforts to renegotiate a relief agreement that expires at the end of the month, a senior UN official said Sunday.

"There is a (UN) mission in Iraq ... to assess the requirements for humanitarian assistance both for relief and rehabilitation," said Mohamed Zejjari, UN co-ordinator in Baghdad. But he said the legal framework governing UN relief operations in Iraq following the end of the current agreement is still under discussion.

Italian election can wait — Amato

ROME (Reuter) — Italy risks falling into chaos if elections are held before the country's voting system is reformed, Prime Minister Giuliano Amato said Sunday.

Interviewed in the Rome newspaper La Repubblica, Amato, whose government has borne the brunt of a political corruption scandal sweeping the country, said an election before reform "would be a very grave error."

British doctor keeps AIDS quiet

BOLTON, England (Reuter) — A British doctor did not tell a hospital he had AIDS before treating about 250 patients in its casualty department, health officials said Sunday.

About 100 people worried they might have been infected by the virus rung a special "hotline" in its first two hours. Officials said the chances of infection were minimal. The doctor did minor "invasive" surgical treatment on only a handful of patients, they said. The unnamed doctor, who died last summer, broke health guidelines by not informing Bolton Royal Infirmary of his condition before working six shifts there in late 1991.


Iran's mosques to show movies

NICOSIA, Cyprus (Reuter) — Iran, facing an acute shortage of movie houses and a huge public interest in illegal video films, is turning some of its mosques into makeshift cinemas.

Islamic Culture Minister Ali Larijani, quoted by Iranian television, said Saturday mosques can apply for permits to show authorized video films for the public from the start of the new Iranian year on March 21. The measure, risking criticism by traditionalist clerics who frowned on previous plans to use Iran's estimated 80,000 mosques as centres for ration-card registration or military recruitment, underlines the importance the government


