(1) The immediate establishment of a number of Royal Commissions of Enquiry to examine into various phases of Government activity and patronage over the past years.

(2) Free education for all students, up to and including Grade XI and the total abolition of the school tax and all school fees in all areas where such now applies. These to be replaced by more generous government grants to school boards.

(3) All drug prescriptions signed by a medical doctor to be subsidized by the Government to the degree that the purchaser will, in no case, be required to pay more than \$1.00 (one dollar) for each prescription.

(12) An immediate study in depth to develop sound government financial policies, for the present and the future.

(13) The immediate establishment of a liquor licencing commission whose function will be to review the existing method of liquor licencing in the Province. All existing licences will be renewable on a yearly basis, and public hearings by the commission will be held in all licencing areas every two years.

(14) A programme to subsidize the cost of fresh milk to the consumer, so that the cost of milk is kept within reasonable bounds.

(15) Implementation of a province-wide home ownership programme.

(16) The immediate establishment of a Ministry of Youth.

- (5) The removal of the sales tax on all children's clothing and footwear up to school-leaving age.
- (6) Memorial University internal affairs to be completely divorced from any government intervention or involvement, but retaining the principle that the government will afford financial aid to the University as required.
- (7) The immediate implementation of long overdue salary increases for civil servants, teachers, nurses, hospital workers, police and firemen.
- (8) The immediate raising of the minimum wage rate for the Province after consultation with representatives of labour, management and the general public.
