Executive Summary

Léger is pleased to present the Privy Council Office with this report on findings from a series of focus groups aimed at capturing Canadians' perceptions of current events that are relevant to the Government of Canada.

This report was prepared by Léger who was contracted by the Privy Council Office (contract number 35035-155036-001/CY awarded June 16, 2015).

1.1 Background and Objectives

The Communications and Consultations Secretariat of the Privy Council Office (PCO) provides advice and support to the Government of Canada, the Clerk of the Privy Council and to departments/agencies on matters relating to communications and consultations, and facilitates the coordination of the Government of Canada's activities in these areas. One tool used in order to fulfill its mandate is public opinion research.

PCO mandated Léger to conduct a survey and focus groups to explore in more detail the concerns and the perceptions of Canadians on current events that are relevant to the federal government.

Through the use of focus groups, PCO wanted to explore the perceptions of Canadians on the state of current events, including for example, their opinions on the current state of the economy. This input was needed because complex issues are often difficult to communicate to the Canadian public in a manner that is easily and clearly understood. By carrying out this research the Canadian government was able to ensure a better understanding of the views and concerns of the public and to develop effective communications strategies and products.

1.2 Methodology

Phase 1

A series of twelve (12) focus groups was held as part of this first phase of research. At each location, groups were comprised of Canadians aged 18 and over, containing a good mix of gender as well as ethnic and educational backgrounds. In addition, groups were split according to income categories. One group in each location was held with participants who have an individual income of less than \$75,000 (or a family income of less than \$100,000), while the other was held with those who have an individual income of \$75,000 or more (or a family income of \$100,000 or more). All participants were also head or co-head of households. The schedule and locations of the groups are presented in the table below.

Twelve (12) participants were recruited for each focus group, ensuring that a minimum of 8 to 10 recruits attended. All participants were recruited over the phone using a recruitment screening questionnaire, presented in Appendix B. Participating individuals were given an \$85 cash incentive to compensate them for their time and cover basic travel expenses.

Phase 2

Focus groups for phase 2 were held in four different locations, as described in the table below. All participants were recruited using a screener questionnaire similar to the one used for phase 1, which can be found in Appendix C.

1.3 Overview of Qualitative Findings

Phase One: Summer Groups

Top-of-Mind Priorities for Canadians

On an unprompted basis, the need to foster economic growth and create jobs was identified by participants as the most pressing concern that should be addressed by the Canadian government. Many participants were worried about the current state of the economy and its future. Some felt there had been very little good economic news over the past few years. Improved fiscal responsibility and lowering of the collective tax burden were also raised as economy-related priorities for the Canadian government.

As a general theme, the environment was also raised fairly frequently. Some felt that Canada needed to find a better balance between using natural resources to foster economic growth and ensuring that such resources would still be available decades from now. Others were more worried about climate change and wanted to see the Canadian government take clear action against it.

Lack of accountability at the Canadian senate was also raised during focus groups. Generally, participants wanted the government to find a way to ensure that senators were more accountable for the quality of their work and for the money senators spend. Noticeably, most participants had very little knowledge of the role of the Senate in the Canadian political system.

Views on the State of the Canadian Economy

Most participants were pessimistic regarding the current state of the Canadian economy. During an exercise when participants were asked to choose up to the three words that best represented how they felt about the Canadian economy, the word chosen most often was “fragile”. Five other words were also chosen frequently by participants in all cities: weak, sluggish, stagnant, uneven and decline. There was a clear sense among participants that Canada’s economy, while not necessarily being in a recession, was facing persistent challenges and did not seem to be improving.

Such perceptions were based on two main considerations. The first was the perceived lack of quality local employment, especially stable, full-time jobs. The second was the collapse of the oil market worldwide and its impact on oil-producing provinces, starting with Alberta.

Overall, unprompted awareness of the Government of Canada’s efforts at opening new markets through trade agreements was low. Most participants felt this was a positive thing for Canada, believing that it may contribute to better opportunities for Canadians companies abroad, while helping local consumers through lower prices for food and other products. Yet, some were worried about local job losses due to international competition and about possible food safety risks for Canadian consumers.

Counter-Terrorism

While Canada's involvement in the fight against ISIS was seldom raised in a spontaneous manner during the groups, it was clear that most participants were aware of the situation, if only in a very general sense. Although few could provide a very detailed description of ISIS and what its objectives were, they knew that it created havoc in the Middle East and seemed to be spreading chaos outside of the region as well.

Views on the Canadian mission in Iraq and Syria were mixed. Those who favoured the mission said that Canada had a responsibility to fight ISIS because Canada had a duty to help its allies as well as suffering people. Others were opposed to the mission in its current form, mainly because of the bombing, yet thought that Canada should be involved in the fight against ISIS. Canada's involvement in training local troops was seen as less invasive or less likely to fuel resentment among local citizens.

Participants who were opposed to both the bombing and training components of the mission were of two minds. Some wanted Canada to be involved in humanitarian assistance in the region instead of military actions. A few others wanted Canada to stay out of the region altogether.

Phase 2: Fall Groups

Top-of-Mind Priorities for Canadians

The seemingly sluggish Canadian economy and the need to create jobs ranked as a top priority for a few individuals in each location. Most participants believed that the Canadian economy, and consequently their local economy, was not performing very well.

Another priority that surfaced across locations was protection of the environment, though the specific focus varied from one participant to the next. Some identified the need to find a better balance between economic growth and the protection of the environment. A few others, mostly in Montréal and Vancouver, talked about the need for Canada to increase its efforts at curbing climate change and reducing its greenhouse gas emissions.

Public finances were mentioned in different forms across all four locations. A few participants talked about the need to keep spending under control in order to maintain balanced budgets and reduce the debt burden of the country. A few others were more concerned with the taxation side of the equation, believing that Canadians like themselves were too heavily taxed, which reduced their standard of living.

A few participants also spontaneously raised concerns about the military mission against ISIS and the imminent arrival of Syrian refugees.

Security and Terrorism

While security and/or terrorism were not often raised spontaneously as one of the most important issues facing Canada today, participants were clearly concerned about security. Most participants did not feel threatened by terrorism on a personal level, but they nevertheless believed that Canada was potentially a target.

Participants were somewhat divided regarding what should be done about the terrorist threat, both at home and abroad. A few thought that by taking the fight to ISIS in Iraq and Syria, Canada was making itself a target of terrorists. But others disagreed with this point of view, believing that terrorists would find a reason to threaten Canada no matter what. Most participants were aware of the government's decision to stop bombing missions. Once more, they were divided as to whether this was a good or bad idea.

As for increasing security efforts inside the country, most participants felt that this would be a good idea. They mostly believed that it would be impossible to completely eliminate the threat, yet they thought more could be done to contain it. They felt that, having nothing to hide, they had no reason to fear additional surveillance.

Syrian Refugees

All participants were aware of the Canadian government's plan to bring in 25,000 refugees by the end of February 2016. Most participants had also heard about the priority placed on bringing in families. Participants' views on the government's plan were mostly positive, but reactions varied across locations. Halifax and Vancouver participants were generally more positive about the arrival of 25,000 refugees, while participants in Toronto and Montréal were more divided.

Reasons for supporting the plan were mostly humanitarian and were steeped in participants' vision of Canada as a country. This reasoning was also present among those who were ambivalent about the plan. They agreed that this was the right thing to do, but felt that it may be necessary for the government to take a bit more time to ensure that everything was done properly rather than rapidly.

Some participants, mainly in Toronto and in Montréal, expressed concerns over possible security issues arising from bringing in 25,000 refugees within a few months. For most of them this concern was not sufficient to oppose the plan, but they would have liked to know more regarding how the government was going to ensure that all security checks would be done properly.

Participants who were more strongly opposed to the government's plan mainly presented their position as driven by a desire to do good by those at home first. To them, there seemed to be a

direct trade-off between helping at home and helping abroad. Another reason commonly raised by those who opposed the plan was the lack of resources, including good job prospects, to properly integrate new arrivals.

Communications Testing

A series of online communications meant to provide information to Canadians on the arrival of Syrian refugees in Canada were tested as part of the group sessions. In all, there were two distinct text messages tested, in addition to five different sets of images that could be used with those messages. English and French versions of the concepts tested can be found in Appendix D.

Message 1: “All Canadians can help welcome Syrian refugees – Get involved”

This version was seen as inviting and as presenting a direct call to action by asking Canadians to “get involved”. By also explicitly stating that all Canadians can do their part, this version of the text generated positive feelings among participants. It was seen as a way to engage individual Canadians. On the other hand, participants who were either concerned or opposed to the government’s plan felt that it put undue pressure on them to do something.

Message 2: “Canada Welcomes Syrian Refugees – Learn More”

This version of the text was deemed more passive, less inviting. It was not seen as a call to action and some felt it created distance between the government’s actions and Canadians. However, participants who were less favourable towards the government’s plan to accept Syrian refugees tended to prefer this version of the text. They believed that it did not imply direct involvement.

Picture Comparisons

All pictures shown generated mostly positive comments. Images of children in particular generated positive emotions among participants. They triggered feelings of hope for a better future. An image showing a family composed of a father, mother and two young children also generated very positive reactions. Once again the presence of kids was appreciated, but participants also liked to see both a mother and a father in the picture. It was seen to represent a large portion of the refugees that will come to Canada.

1.4 Note on Interpretation of Research Findings

The views and observations expressed in this document do not reflect those of the Privy Council Office. This report was compiled by Léger based on the research conducted specifically for this project.

While care and consideration was taken to represent the target audience, findings from this qualitative research (i.e. focus groups) should be considered directional only and results should not be projected as representative of the entire Canadian population. It is intended to provide deeper insight into the underlying reasons for opinions or lack thereof.
