ASSISTED MUNICIPALITIES ON A GENEROUS SCALE

Since 1958 financial assistance by the province to municipalities, schools and hospitals has reached a total of over \$640,000,000 in grants which is substantially more than the total paid in local taxes by all the people of Alberta during the same period.

IMPROVED AND EXTENDED SOCIAL SERVICES

In the past five years the Departments of Health, Welfare and Education have spent over \$675,000,000 to provide the most advanced social services in Canada.

COMPLETED VAST PUBLIC WORKS PROGRAMS

During the past five years the Departments of Highways and Public Works have spent over \$300,000,000 on the construction of highways, bridges and public buildings, all fully paid for.

KEPT PROVINCIAL TAXES AT A LOW RATE

With the lowest gasoline tax in Canada and no sales tax Alberta collects a smaller percentage of revenue from direct taxation than any other province.

Almost Completed . . .

THE 5 YEAR PROGRAM

Begun in 1959 this program is being implemented in full.

THE MAIN FEATURES INCLUDE:

- 53 modern lodges and 270 housekeeping units built at a cost of \$13,300,000 in Edmonton and Calgary and 40 other centres in all parts of the province.
- Community improvement, including street paving, and recreation grants totalling nearly \$7,000,000 to more than 400 communities.
- 42 active and auxiliary hospital projects at a cost of more than \$45,000,000, including the Foothills General Hospital and Diagnostic Centre at Calgary now under construction.
- Over \$350,000,000 has been provided for education since 1959, including about \$60,000,000 for the University of Alberta and \$5,000,000 in financial aid to deserving students.

And Now . . .

THE NEXT BIG STEP FORWARD

A blueprint for continued progress.

- A program of subsidized voluntary prepaid medical insurance to bring the cost of medical services within the financial reach of all citizens.
- A \$500,000,000 program for education as a sound investment in the youth and future of our province.
- A Northern Development Council to foster and advance the development of the vast potential of Northern Alberta.
- The training and organization of a force of municipal law enforcement officers for towns, villages, counties and rural municipal districts desirous of using this service.
- Provision of nursing-home care through private and public facilities.
- A Veterinary College at Edmonton subject to a satisfactory agreement with the Government of Canada.
- A major program of new construction to further improve our extensive network of all-weather highways and district roads.
- An Alberta Investment Fund to enable Alberta citizens to participate in the development of their own province.

Edgar Gerhart was elected to the Alberta Legislature in 1952 for Edmonton and has been re-elected both in 1955 and 1959.

Mr. Gerhart was educated in Coronation, Alberta, and it was this area that his father represented as M.L.A. and as a Member of the Provincial Cabinet. Edgar later attended the University of Alberta and graduated in Pharmacy with the degree of B.Sc. and has since obtained the degree of Bachelor of Laws.

Mr. Gerhart is a Pharmacist in Edmonton and also a practicing Lawyer. His interest in a political career started in University where he was the Official Leader of the Opposition for three years in the University Mock Parliament.
